



CARB Exemption

The majority of composite wood products in North America are made with resins containing formaldehyde. Formaldehyde is listed with the State of California as a known carcinogen. The California Air Resources Board (CARB) has enacted the Airborne Toxic Control Measure (ATCM). It is a regulation designed to limit the emissions of formaldehyde from products sold in California. It sets emissions limits from those products and develops a chain-of-custody tracking system to ensure compliance. All Plummer Forest Products particleboard products are exempt from CARB regulations.

What does this exemption mean? It means our Formaldehyde-Free products neither contain nor emit formaldehyde, and CARB has granted PFP an exemption from their rule. They have issued us an exemption number, N-10-002a, and no chain-of-custody is necessary when using or reselling our product.
